## Our terrific transition days

Before our doors officially opened, students were given a sneak preview of life at The Island Free School over two 'terrific' Transition Days.

Every July, Transition Days are held across the Island to give Year 6 students a taster of their new secondary schools – and the feedback we had was 'bring on September!' 125 pupils from 28 different primary schools were welcomed by Headmaster Mr Boyd, who hosted a special assembly, introducing the children to his 'challenge chest'. Pupils were asked to solve a series of clues so that they could crack the code to open the chest and win an iPod (well done Georgia!).

Pupils were given sample lessons and activities included:

- Finding their own superpowers in Drama
- Kitchen chemistry in Science
- An historical costume challenge in History
- Making photographs with sun paper in Art
- Writing a postcard in Latin.

# When the students met **STOMP**



t's not every day that you get to meet the stars – and be treated like a VIP – but the music scholars from The Island Free School

didn't skip a beat. In the summer, they were taken by staff on a special visit to see STOMP's hit West End show. The flamboyant percussionist troupe use everything from brooms to basketballs to make music, and play to packed houses all over the world. Afterwards, the ten children met the performers and asked questions. To add to the excitement of the day, the students were filmed by a TV crew, who are making a documentary about The Island Free School, which will be aired later this year.

"It was such a wonderful day", says Mr Peace, the school's Head of Year 7. "The children were thrilled to meet the cast and get the star treatment from the film crew – and who knows, one day, it could be them up there on stage, performing to a full house. These particular students were selected for their musical aptitude, and will receive free musical tuition throughout their time at the school. They have such talent and potential, it's a real possibility that they will be the stars of the future."

After the show, the children had a meal in an Italian restaurant and a stroll along the Thames – before it was time to return to the Island.

Says Mr Peace: "We hope this trip will inspire them to achieve great things and it's the first of many activities that will be educational, motivational, and a whole lot of fun. All the pupils at our new school will benefit from a range of musical experiences, as we're a music specialist school – and by music, we mean pop, jazz, classical, funk, latin, hiphop, you name it. They will be able to play a wide range of instruments, including drums, saxophones and electric guitars. We might even teach them how to play the bin lids, like STOMP!"



#### SEPTEMBER 2014:

The school will open to our first Year 7 intake at our beautiful temporary site in Leeson Road, Lower Ventnor.

#### DECEMBER 2014:

Work will start on the new building. Our chosen contractors will follow guidance set out in the Considerate Constructors' Scheme so that residents experience minimal disruption

#### AUGUST 2015:

Phase 1 of the building will be completed in Upper Ventnor.

#### SEPTEMBER 2015:

We will move into our new site on Newport Road. Meanwhile, work will continue on Phase 2 (that will not interrupt the running of the school).

#### DECEMBER 2015:

Phase 2 will finish and the new school will be fully completed.

We're looking forward to working closely with local businesses and residents, as the exciting plans for our brand new school in Upper Ventnor begin to take shape.

he Island Free School opens in September 2014 to the first intake of Year 7 students. We will start off in our beautiful temporary home, in Leeson Road in Lower Ventnor (where St Francis Catholic and Church of England Primary School used to be based).

Meanwhile, a smart new school will be constructed for us in Upper Ventnor. The Governors and Headmaster have been in touch with the ten building contractors on an approved list supplied by the Department for Education and Secretary of State.

Over the next few months, the senior team will be interviewing the contractors and choosing an appropriate design for the building, which will be no higher than two storeys, to fit in with the local landscape.

Says Headmaster Mr Boyd: "Almost opposite the new site, on Newport Road in Upper Ventnor, is the new St Francis School - this is a striking and well designed building, that we greatly admire. We will ensure that the design we choose is complementary to theirs, using similar materials, such as cedar cladding and white rendering."

"Our contractor will use the same modern pre-fabricated technology, that's quick to put up, high quality, and cost-effective. The grounds will be enhanced by interesting planting and a grassy nature area. As soon as we have gone through the process of selecting a contractor, then we will share our ideas and welcome comments."

"This school will have outstanding facilities, including £1m of ICT equipment, because our students deserve the very best."

## IT'S OFFICIAL

r Boyd was invited to a very special reception at the House of Lords on Wednesday 9 July. The event was to mark the official launch of a number of Free Schools – including our school. All the Free Schools opening this year, known as 'the class of 2014', went through a rigorous selection procedure before funding was approved. From 400 initial applications, 245 made the shortlist, and 103 have now reached the preopening phase. 80 of these schools – including The Island Free School – open in September 2014.

## **GOOD SPORT**

We have taken over **Rew Valley**Sports Centre – an outstanding sports facility in Upper Ventnor, which was earmarked by the Council for closure. The school will now run this centre, giving access to St Francis Primary School and local community groups. This is one of the few spaces in the Island suitable for indoor cricket. It also comes with an astroturf pitch and large section of the playing field that can accommodate a running track, football pitches, a rugby or hockey pitch, and a cricket pitch with small pavilion.





### **OUR HERITAGE**

We will be working with the Ventnor and Undercliff Heritage Partnership to create trails around town – our historic starter home, built in 1905, is likely to feature on the routes!
